

Addendum 1

to be included with the Select Board meeting minutes of July 15, 2013.

The Select Board minutes of July 15, 2013, was an item on the Select Board meeting agenda for September 12, 2013, postponed to September 16, 2013, and then again to September 23, 2013.

The response from Leukhardt to Coler's seven (7) page document presented to the Select Board on July 1, 2013, accusing Leukhardt of conflict of interest and of not filing the appropriate forms. Leukhardt responds (approximately 1hr. 51 min. into the recorded SB meeting).

Leukhardt states she has given Coler's July 1, 2013, document a lot of thought. Leukhardt states Coler has initiated character assassination directed at her approximately five (5) times since Coler joined the Select Board in May 2012. He has done so by writing documents, passing documents to other agencies and/or making verbal statements. Leukhardt states this is a weapon Coler is using against her. Leukhardt states Coler's document of July 1, 2013, contains a veiled threat to Leukhardt. It does not sit well with her. Leukhardt will continue to defend and fight for the rights of any citizen in any way she sees fit. She will help anyone who asks for her help and will do what she thinks is best for the town. Leukhardt states she has no conflict of interest issues, neither past, current nor anticipated in the future. Leukhardt found it odd and wondered why people are reporting to Coler what Leukhardt is doing in this town in her car or otherwise. Coler's report, at the Select Board meeting of July 1, 2013, that Leukhardt was seen with Suzanne Corbett and Deb Nicholson in her car, felt creepy to be so watched and reported. Leukhardt states the other two board members are more concerned about her tone than false statements in documents from agencies involved with this board, namely the report of false information being distributed to HUD by HRA and confirmed as such by Robin Sherman at the Select Board meeting June 24, 2013. Leukhardt states people coming before the Select Board should expect tough questions and expect the board is going to probe for information. Leukhardt repeats that she will continue to defend and fight for the rights of any town citizen, if asked. Leukhardt will do what she thinks is best to do for the town. Because Coler addressed his memorandum to the Chair, Carter, asking for action, Leukhardt directs her need for action to Carter.
